# **Background**

The nuclear industry has been through a series of major changes over the last 20 years, subsequently affecting the overall skill base and effective management of knowledge.

A long period of reduced activity through the late 1980s, 1990s and early 2000s resulted in fewer new recruits and a workforce that is rapidly approaching retirement. In order for successful decommissioning in the long term, the industry must actively manage its knowledge and skills base. Structural changes to the sector means that expertise can be drawn from across and throughout the supply chain, and there are also other opportunities to learn from advances in related sectors, such as non-nuclear land and waste management.

This event will discuss how this accumulated knowledge can be transferred to new employees and across the supply chain with steps that can be taken to successfully ensure this transition to the next generation of nuclear industry workers. There will be a facilitated session discussing some of the challenges the nuclear supply chain face. It will consider how the supply chain can be part of the solution for the Site Licence Companies and the industry as a whole, and how sector agencies and institutions can support the strategies that will need to be put in place. Delegates will gain the opportunity to:

- hear the latest from the National Skills Academy for nuclear and the NDA Skills and Capabilities Strategy identifying how they are engaging with this issue
- hear from industry speakers about how particular changes in the industry have contributed to the challenges of skills and knowledge that now need to be solved
